

USAID/ENGAGE National Civic Engagement Poll

Fieldwork: November 1 – December 4, 2018

Methodology: quantitative survey of Ukrainian population

Survey Purpose

The USAID/ENGAGE National Civic Engagement Poll concentrates on gauging citizen engagement and participation, and public attitudes towards civil society organizations, as well as citizens' participation and perception of reform processes in Ukraine.

Data collection

Field work was conducted from November-December 2018 through Computer Assisted Personal Interviewing. Interviews were conducted with residents of Ukraine aged 18 years old and older.


Sample design corresponds to the distribution of the adult population of Ukraine by age, sex, oblast and settlement type according to the data of the State Statistics Service of Ukraine as of January 1, 2017 (excluding AR Crimea and NGCA of the Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts).

The sample size is 2,073. The margin of error of the total sample, not including design effect, does not exceed 2.2% for the national sample.





Q: Are you engaged in the life of your community (building, street, district)?






Q: Did you participate in CSO activities during the last year?






Q: What are you personally willing to do to help settle the current crisis in Eastern Ukraine?













Q: What are the three most important issues for Ukraine today?




















Q: How much do you agree or disagree with each of these statements? (3/3)

Combatting of corruption/bribery is possible only if public servants wages will be increased






